SQUASH MEDLEY

1 lb. yellow squash
1 onion finely diced
1 green pepper diced
2 tbsp. butter or margarine
1 egg, beaten
1 cup + 2 tbsp. shredded cheddar cheese
1/4 tsp. salt
1/8 tsp. pepper

Place squash in saucepan. Add just enough water to cover. Bring to boil. Cover pan, reduce heat and simmer just until tender, about 5 minutes. Drain well.

In a small skillet, sauté onions and peppers in butter until tender and lightly browned. Add mixture to squash, along with egg, 1 cup cheese, salt & pepper. Toss gently. Place mixture into a greased 1 ½ qt. casserole and sprinkle with the remaining cheese.

Bake at 350° for 30 minutes.

The Indian Village Community Association held its Semiannual Meeting at Indian Village Elementary School. President Deb Dambra called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Board of Governors in attendance were: Pat Doran, John Dambra, Marcy Malloris, Judy Alcott., Stan Robinson, Sally Williams, and Jan Tidwell.

Guests

Gina Kostoff, Board of Public Works

Ms. Kostoff explained CEDIT funds were prioritized according to the engineer's assessment of critical need. Now they are focusing on concrete residential streets. She said Barrett Law could be used for sidewalk repairs. Petitions (preferably 60% agreement) can be filed to move project up the list. A new technology to lift affected slabs, grind tree roots, and replace slab is being considered. Shaving the roots does compromise the integrity of the tree. Rudisill will be getting bike lanes, Ardmore widening from Jefferson to Taylor is underway.

Ken Nicolet, Mayor's Advocate 427-1122

Mr. Nicolet brought brochures on the National Historic Register, Parks and Rec summer activities, Tin Caps baseball schedule, and information on the Great American Clean up in May. The overhaul to the MLK Bridge at Clinton and Fourth Street will be completed 2011-12. He advises the association to work together.

Angie Quinn, ARCH

A plaque for our National Historic Register distinction should be ready in May. She explained the Home Tour expectations for June 25, 2011. It is a partnership with ARCH to show the public our unique neighborhood.

Brian Miller, Liaison Officer

Brian Miller was unable to attend.

Gayla McMurray, Pocahontas Pool

Ms. McMurray explained the new pricing structure for pool membership. Families of three or more pay \$350, two people \$250, single \$150 for the summer season. Stock no longer exists. Aerobic classes, specific lap times, adult parties, and family events are being planned. They are raising money for capital improvements with a car

wash at Wendy's and will hold a garage sale in June, donations of items gladly accepted.

Paul Eigman, Earth First

Mr. Eigman gave an overview of this trash removal company. The contract rebids in July 2010.

Tim Pape, Fifth District Councilman

Mr. Pape said active associations get the City's attention. He stated 80% of the city funds are used for police, fire, parks, and infrastructure. He likes the competition in garbage removal, and touched on the topics of combining the emergency call centers and the County and City offices in the Renaissance Building. He fielded residents concerns about the Village streets and promised to look into the matter.

Business Matters

The minutes of the Semiannual Meeting of October 6, 2009 were approved.

The Proposed Budget for 2010 was discussed and approved.

Board of Governor Elections

Nominated for positions on the Board of Governors: Blake Egly and Sarah Didier Vote taken from the floor: elected unanimously.

Rental Issue

Pat Doran gave an update on the status of amending the Protective Covenants to include a rental provision. A committee has been formed to coordinate the changes. Residents will receive a letter detailing the new covenants and meetings will be held to notarize signatures on formal petitions for passage.

Resident Concerns

Safety patrols from a private company will be considered to run Memorial Day to the end of October.

52 residents were in attendance. Door prizes were awarded to the Pearsons and the Miskellys. The next Semiannual Meeting will be held in October of 2010.
