We had a neighbor whose driveway was completely covered with branches and many were quite large. There was no way anyone was getting a car out of that driveway, even in an emergency. After Wawonaissa was cleared, that driveway was the next place neighbors went to work. I am proud to live in a neighborhood where neighbors are there for each other. Indian Village residents rock!

Protective Covenants

Proposed changes to the Indian Village Protective Covenants were distributed to residents in June. We had planned to have the first signing during the 4th of July Picnic. Obviously, that didn't happen. We are now going to have the first signing of the changes/additions to the Covenants during the Labor Day Picnic. You will need to have a photo ID to be able to sign. We will have 2 notaries that will be checking those ID's prior to your signing.

Just in case any of you didn't receive the proposed changes/ additions, I will try to summarize them.

- 1. Addition of a no rental policy. This does not mean that current renters will lose their homes; they will be grandfathered in.
- 2. In the Signs and Billboards section the word lease will be removed.

- 3. The Mandatory Maintenance Fees will go from \$30 per year to \$50 per year, if passed.
- 4. Addition of the Board of Governors, based on budgetary needs, may raise the Maintenance Fees no more than one time each calendar year, for no more than 20%.
