## **Energizing Indiana**

The following information was related to Indian Village residents at the October 10 Semiannual Membership Meeting by Nathan Sikora.

The State of Indiana Regulatory Commission came together in 2009 and found that Indiana is 10th largest consumer of electricity in the country. This is what prompted the development of Energizing Indiana which rolled out in 2012. Energizing Indiana is working with nonprofit organizations to spread the word about the in home energy audits. Each resident can receive, at no cost, an energy audit and for each of those audits that are completed Indian Village will receive \$25.

During the audit, you will receive 9 CFL light bulbs, 2 high efficiency shower heads, and 3 sink aerators to be installed in your home, at the time of the audit, if you desire. If you don't want the items installed, the auditor will leave them with you to do with as you please. The audit takes about 1 to 1 ½ hours.

The auditor will put all the information he compiles, regarding your home, into an iPad and then, from the results, will make recommendations as to what you should have done to your home to make it more energy efficient. The best part is that after your audit is over you will never hear from them again. You won't get any calls from insulation companies, or other contractors to perform work. The overall scope of the program is to have a 2% energy reduction, in the state of Indiana, by 2019.

Included inside this Smoke Signals, you will find the form to fill out and submit so you can receive your home energy audit. Remember, for each energy audit performed, Indian Village will receive \$25.

## **October Semiannual Meeting**

As we near the end of 2012, I would like to reflect on the past year in Indian Village. We had some more street work completed on Wenonah Lane by Indian Village Elementary School. We also had street resurfacing on the streets around our "Tee Pee Park" area (Indian Village Blvd.). Thanks to Geoff Paddock, our 5th District Councilman, we were awarded sufficient monies for a project to light our main entrance monument on Manito Blvd. We started our work on getting signatures to change and update our covenants.

Our annual activities: Two Semiannual Association Meetings, two addition wide garage sales, Easter egg hunt, 4th of July picnic and parade (which was a Labor Day event this year) and now we are about to have our annual Holiday lighting contest.

When the June 29, 2012, storm hit, we were without electricity for an extended period of time during a triple digit heat wave. I am very grateful for those of you who pitched in and helped clear the roads of branches and debris from the 91 mph wind gusts which we experienced during this very trying time. These were the days when the "good neighbors" were clearly defined by their actions in our neighborhood. It wasn't that long ago when we experienced the ice storm which also left us without electricity for an extended period of time and took down many tree limbs, too. But we survived both storms and are here to tell the tales.

As we begin a new year, it's that time of the year to receive your annual association dues billings. There are residents in Indian Village who question the "value" of \$30 annual association dues. In addition to the annual events we hold in our association, we are also responsible for additional security which we hire for extra protection during the summer months and also the holiday period of the year, when burglaries seem to escalate. We pay for bug spraying in our addition. We have associated expenses for newsletters and any other printed items which are published. We have an annual audit by a C.P.A., we have insurance expenses, storage expenses and we require the services of an attorney from time to time. We also have expenses when liens are filed on properties who are delinquent in their annual association dues payments. We also require maintenance on our monuments, as well as, the landscaping for common areas. We provide an association website with information both on our association activities, as well as, covenants and by-laws, history of Indian Village and tie ins to the City of Fort Wayne website.

The Board of Indian Village Community Association takes our responsibility very seriously in providing services to our residents which protect them, maintain the upkeep of our addition and insure a "quality of life" for all who live here.

As the winter months approach, please keep an eye out for our oldest residents and their possible snow shoveling needs. Please report any suspicious persons or activities you may witness to 911.
