Indian Village residents are invited to attend our 4TH of July celebration and watch the parade as it winds its way through the Village to Psi Ote Park!

Children of the Village, ages 1-12, are invited to decorate their bikes, trikes, strollers, wagons or skates and register beginning at 11:00 a.m. at the corner of Indian Village Boulevard and Nokomis for the parade beginning at 11:45 a.m. Those entered in the parade will line up by age groups along the first block of Nokomis off the Boulevard.

Judging for the three best decorations in each group will be done by the City Firemen at 11:30. Prizes will be awarded at Psi Ote Park after the picnic.

The parade begins at 11:45 a.m. and will follow the City fire truck along Indian Village Boulevard to Hiawatha Boulevard to Ojibway Trail to Wenonah Lane ending at Psi Ote Park.

Sign up for door prizes at Psi Ote Park. At 12:00 p.m. a picnic of chicken or Coney hotdogs, chips, pop and dessert will be served at Psi Ote Pavilion. Remember to bring lawn chairs or blankets for seating.

After the picnic, take a walk around the Village to see the Best Yards of 2013. Signs will mark the top three winning yards and a listing of Honorable Mention Yards will be posted at the Pavilion.

311 - ONE CALL TO CITY HALL

Some residents might not be aware of the 311 One Call to City Hall or know exactly what it is used for. Some examples are reporting yards overgrown with weeds, fallen limbs from city trees that might have landed on your property and need removal, potholes, streetlights flickering or cut, dogs running loose. The 311 operators can answer many questions you have, write a report "ticket" to correct the problem and/or direct you to the appropriate department to handle your complaint or request.

If you experience any of these or other concerns, do not hesitate to call 311. While Board members are always glad to make these calls for you, they will ask you for the specific concern and exact address and do a "drive by" to verify the complaint and address prior to making the call. If you do make a call, it never hurts to let a board member know so we can monitor repeated problems at a specific address.

SUMMER WEED PROGRAM

The City's Summer Weed Program was developed to eliminate environmental nuisances from neighborhoods. The law prohibits any growth of weeds, grass or other rank vegetation on private property which is: neglected, disregarded or not cut, mowed, or otherwise removed and/or which has attained a height of nine (9) inches or more. Once Neighborhood Code receives a complaint about weeds or high grass, they verify the violation and, if valid, a sign will be posted in the yard stating if the weeds/grass are not removed from this property within five (5) days, the City will cut the weeds/grass and remove trash, if necessary. The City will then seek recovery of the actual cost from the property owner. Please call 311 and provide the exact address of the property in violation and it will be checked out within two days.
