## **Easter Egg Hunt**

If a couple of weeks go by and the City has yet to address the issue, when you call back and give them that reference number, they will be able to tell you where you stand in line.

Another resident had concerns about children playing on the monuments. Parents, PLEASE talk to your children and tell them to stay off the monuments. It is not safe for your children and it is not good for the monuments. Those monuments are historical and very expensive to keep in good condition. Children playing on the monuments does not help them one bit!

# **Great American Cleanup**

# What to Bring:

1) Picture ID for you and your spouse, if married and filing jointly; 2) Social Security or ITIN cards and birth dates for you, your spouse, and dependents you are claiming; 3) W-2, unemployment, and/or 1099 forms for ALL jobs held in 2013; 4) Any letter or notice you received from the IRS; 5) A copy of last year's return; 6) If direct deposit: savings and/or checking account routing numbers; 7) Your spouse, if married filing jointly; 8) Landlord name, address, and amount of rent paid in 2013; 9) If you paid for child care - documentation listing provider name, address, tax ID#,- and amount paid; 10) If you, your spouse, or a child attended college - tuition expense statement (1098T) and/or student loan interest statement (1098E); and 11) Home interest and property tax paid.
